No.	Questions Received	CSE's responses
1.	Can you provide more colour on the impact of the Iran war, Straits of Hormuz blockade and the rise in energy prices on the company? Please explain and elaborate.	<p>At present, the Company has no material direct exposure to the Iran conflict or any potential disruption arising from the Straits of Hormuz, given our relatively limited and significantly reduced presence in the Middle East since 2017.</p> <p>That said, we are closely monitoring developments with particular attention to potential supply chain disruptions and related second-order impacts. These include volatility in global energy prices, which could indirectly affect input costs for certain materials, as well as possible disruptions to freight and logistics. In particular, any constraints along key shipping routes may lead to longer lead times and increased transportation costs for equipment and components.</p> <p>Operationally, our supply chain remains resilient, but we remain mindful of potential disruptions. The majority of our key components are sourced from established suppliers within our core operating markets, which reduces reliance on affected transit routes. In addition, we have implemented inventory buffers for critical components and have identified alternative sourcing channels where appropriate to mitigate potential disruptions.</p> <p>From a commercial perspective, our customer contracts generally include provisions such as force majeure and cost variation mechanisms. These provide a degree of protection against unforeseen disruptions and input cost fluctuations arising from supply chain constraints.</p> <p>Overall, while we do not currently see a material direct impact, we remain vigilant and proactive in managing potential indirect risks to ensure continuity of operations and cost discipline.</p>

<p>2.</p>	<p>I noted that CSE Global operates in the Middle East, in countries such as the UAE. These include subsidiaries such as "CSE TransTel Middle East FZE (United Arab Emirates). How have the operations of our subsidiaries been affected by the Iran war? Did they suffer any damage due to the war? Can you quantify the impact of the Iran war on our Middle East business/operations? Please elaborate in detail.</p>	<p>The Group's exposure to the Middle East is currently minimal, following a strategic scaling down of our operations in the region over the past several years.</p> <p>In particular, our former subsidiary, CSE TransTel Middle East FZE in the United Arab Emirates, had been dormant for an extended period and was formally liquidated in 2025 pursuant to a members' voluntary liquidation. As such, we do not have any active operating entities or material business activities in the Middle East at this time.</p> <p>Accordingly, the ongoing Iran conflict has had no direct operational impact on the Group. There has been no damage to assets, facilities, or personnel, as we do not maintain a physical operating presence in the affected areas.</p> <p>From a financial perspective, the contribution from the Middle East to the Group's revenue and profits has been negligible in recent years, and therefore there is no material quantifiable impact on our current financial performance arising from the situation.</p> <p>That said, we continue to monitor broader geopolitical developments closely, particularly for any indirect or second-order effects such as energy price volatility, supply chain disruptions, or changes in global economic conditions, which could have a wider impact on our operations across other regions.</p>
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
